

## REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Notice is hereby given that Clackamas County Service District No. 1, through its Board of County Commissioners, will receive sealed proposals per specifications until **4:00 PM April 28, 2016**, for

### **WATERSHED HEALTH EDUCATION SUPPORT FOR CLACKAMAS COUNTY SERVICE DISTRICT NO. 1**

No proposals will be received or considered after that time.

Clackamas County Service District No. 1 has identified a need for watershed health education support throughout the District to increase and enhance education within the public schools and to meet requirements by permits and regulations. The initial contract will be through June 30, 2017 with the option for two 1-year renewals.

Proposal packets are available from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM Monday through Thursday at Clackamas County Procurement, Clackamas County Public Services Building, 2051 Kaen Road, Oregon City, OR 97045, telephone (503) 742-5444. Sealed proposals are to be sent to Lane Miller – Procurement Manager at the Kaen Road address. Proposals will be opened in the Procurement Division, located on the fourth floor of the Public Services Building, at the designated time.

Each proposal must contain a statement as to whether the vendor is a resident vendor, as defined in ORS 279A.120. This **is not** a public works contract subject to ORS 279C.800 through 279C.870, the Davis Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a).

The Clackamas County Board of County Commissioners, acting as the Governing Body of the Clackamas County Service District No. 1 (District), reserves the right to reject any and all proposals not in compliance with all prescribed public bidding procedures and requirements, and may reject for good cause any and all proposals upon the finding that it is in the public interest to do so and to waive any and all informalities in the public interest. In the award of the contract, the Board of County Commissioners, acting as the Governing Body of the District, will consider the element of time, will accept the proposal or proposals which in their estimation will best serve the interests of the District and will reserve the right to award the contract to the contractor whose proposal shall be best for the public good.
