Notice is hereby given that Clackamas County, through its Board of County Commissioners, will open sealed bids in the Office of the Procurement Division Director for the

LUSTED ROAD PAVING PACKAGE

No bids will be received or considered after the time of closing.

Clackamas County is soliciting bids for this asphalt paving package to resurface approximately 5.8 miles of roads. Work includes, but is not limited to, placing approximately 17,550 tons of asphalt; grinding about 4,970 square yards of asphalt; placing pavement markings and striping; installing traffic signal loop detectors; installing, maintaining, and removing temporary work zone traffic control measures; and performing additional incidental work as called for by the specifications and plans. Work is to be substantially completed by August 31, 2016 with a contract completions date of October 28, 2016. The engineer's estimate for the work is approximately \$2,000,000.

To perform work, Bidders must be prequalified with Clackamas County in the class of Asphalt Concrete Paving and Oiling (ACP). **Under ORS 279C.430, proof of prequalification for the classes of work herein must be submitted to the County by 2:00 PM, June 29, 2016.**

This is a public work contract subject to ORS 279C.800 to 279C.870 **or** if applicable, the federal prevailing rate of wage required under the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141 et seq.).

Bid packets will be available at Clackamas County Procurement, Clackamas County Public Services Building, 2051 Kaen Road, Oregon City, OR 97045, phone 503-742-5444. **Hours of operation are Monday through Thursday from 7 AM to 6 PM.** Sealed bids are to be sent to George Marlton – Procurement Division Director at the Kaen Road address. Bids will be opened in the Procurement Division, located on the fourth floor of the Public Services Building, at the designated time.

The Clackamas County Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all bids not in compliance with all prescribed public bidding procedures and requirements, may reject for good cause any and all bids upon the finding that it is in the public interest to do so, and may waive any and all informalities.
