- Marsha Hazelwood requested that the CPO be notified of the passing of Pauline Beuler on November 11, 2017 at the age of 88. Pauline was an OTSB board member, a David-Douglas teacher and prior president of our CPO.

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Old Business

- Land use applications for growing and compressing hay from other areas were approved as an allowed use and no conditional use permit was required.
- Craig Klasius pointed out the the potholes had been filled and the abandoned car removed since our last meeting. As a reminder, an application that allows easy reporting of potholes, which may speed up county repair is found at this site: seeclckfix.com/clackamas-county
- The issue of a proposed guardrail on Bull Run Road just below the water bureau gate was revisited. Craig Klasius motioned to follow up with a second from Jon Steward. Leila Blakey agree to follow up with the engineering department of DOT.

Suggested contact is: Joe Merrick (Traffic Design Manager). Chlorine gas transportation is under the purview of the City of Portland.

- Adopt a road program was reviewed and a motion made to adopt the section from Ten-Eyck to Elsner roads by Leila Blakey and seconded by Craig Klasius. The motioned carried.

New Business

- Leila Blakely would like to know what the emergency notification process is for wildfires in the area. Jon Steward stated the the county Sheriff is in charge of evacuations and suggested that we get in on that planning process and also think about fire proofing properties. No motions were made to follow up on this topic at this time.
