Our meeting started at 7:00. Present were Brent Parries, pres.; Meg Wiesheier, vice pres.; Charlene DeBruin, secretary; Simon DeBruin, treasurer; and board members Carol Hausafus, Earlean Marsh and Tom State.

Voting eligibility requirement: must have signed in at least one meeting during the past twelve months, and own a business or be resident or property owner within the CPO boundaries.

Minutes were approved as sent.

The treasury began with 820.50 and has a balance of \$915.50. The county reimbursement for 2 years was 156.00, we spent 76. For post office box and deposit ----- cash.

We had requested an interactive meeting, but got another lecture- (Scott H reading a well prepared report which could have been sent out ahead of the meeting). I assume all of us can read and none of it was new.. This wasted 40 minutes which could have been better spent informing us of legislation proposed to deal with the shortcomings of code enforcement, AND LISTENING TO OUR CONCERNS AND SUGGESTIONS.

I did like the venue, the public safety bldg. in Clackamas, which is easier to access and

seemed to have good acoustics.

More microphones would have helped, and those responding to questions should have been up front and center, not back in a corner.

We did learn that Code enforcement is top heavy in management, 3 managers, 3 field workers and only one car.
