

## Criminal Prosecution

### Felony Crime

The Clackamas County District Attorney's Office issued charges in over **2,275 adult felony cases** during 2015.



- Property offenses include burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and fraud/forgery.
- Violent offenses include homicide, rape or sexual assault, robbery and assault.
- Drug offenses include drug possession and drug trafficking.
- Conduct offenses include attempting to elude a police officer, failure to appear, escape, public indecency, and failure to report as a sex offender.

### Misdemeanor Crime

Over **3,600 misdemeanor cases** were reviewed and prosecuted. The top 10% misdemeanor offenses by charge; included driving under the influence of intoxicants, theft, driving while suspended or revoked, assault, harassment, criminal trespass, failure to appear, failure to perform duties of a driver when property damaged, and criminal mischief.

## Criminal Prosecution

### Case Management Program

This program continued to increase the efficiency of the criminal justice system by ensuring prompt resolution of cases

- ◆ An average of 33% of all criminal cases were settled with a guilty plea within five weeks after the first court appearance
- ◆ Only 15% of all criminal cases were set for trial which resulted in a dramatic reduction in court appearances for victims, witnesses and law enforcement

### Family Support

During the past federal fiscal year, prosecutors and support enforcement agents **collected \$23.2 Million Dollars in past due child support**. This revenue goes directly to children and families who may otherwise rely on county or state resources for financial support.

### Victim Assistance

Advocates provided direct services to **over 1000 victims of domestic violence** and assisted with over 730 protective orders.

### Juvenile Dependency

Prosecutors worked closely with the State Department of Human Services to protect children who come to the attention of authorities as a result of abuse or neglect. In 2015, they provided legal consultation, support, and courtroom advocacy on **233 juvenile dependency cases**.
