- Write the amount you would like deducted from every pay period for the Clackamas County Peace Officer's Benevolent Foundation.
- Sign this form and return to Payroll (4th floor Public Services Building). *Please do not send electronically.*
- You must indicate if you wish to give on an ongoing basis or only during the current calendar year.
- If you indicate you wish to give only during the calendar year, you must re-enroll during Open Enrollment for the following year.

Payroll Deduction and Organization Information**

Charitable Giving Organization Guidelines:

- * Organizations must serve the people of Clackamas County.
- * Organizations must be 501(c)3 Organizations.
- * There will be approximately ten charitable giving organizations available to employees for payroll deductions annually.
- * Employees may nominate organizations for annual consideration by the A-Team.
- * Employees may begin payroll deductions effective the first of the calendar year if submitted during Open Enrollment or when become first benefits eligible at the beginning of their employment.
- * If less than five employees sign up for monthly giving, the organization *may not* be included.
- * Payroll deductions will on the second paycheck of each month.
- * For one-time donations, please contribute directly to the organization of your choice.
