**In The Matter of Writing Off Uncollectible Accounts for the
Second Quarter of Fiscal Year 2010**

The Housing Authority of Clackamas County (HACC), a Division of the Department of Human Services, requests the approval to write off uncollectible rents, late charges and maintenance expenses for the second quarter of fiscal year 2010 (October 1, 2009 – December 31, 2009). The uncollectible amounts are detailed on the attached worksheet.

Uncollectible amounts for the second quarter of fiscal year 2010 will be \$15,003.86 for Low Rent Public Housing. Of the total second quarter write offs, \$6,335.35 was for uncollected rents and \$8,668.51 was for maintenance repairs charged to tenants for repairs required to units before the HACC could lease them to a new tenant.

The total amount proposed for transfer from Accounts Receivable to Collection Loss for the second quarter of fiscal year 2010 will be \$15,003.86. Total collection losses for fiscal year 2009 were \$27,324.23.

Recommendation

HACC recommends the approval to write off uncollectible rents, late charges and maintenance expenses and for the Executive Director to be authorized to approve the transfer of these accounts from Accounts Receivable to Collection Loss.



The Office for Children and Families of the Department of Human Services requests the approval of an amendment to an Intergovernmental Revenue Agreement with the State of Oregon acting by and through its Oregon Commission on Children and Families for the receipt of state grant funds for the 09-11 Biennium. This amendment allocates funding for the Healthy Start program through June 30, 2010. Healthy Start provides home visits to first time parents here in Clackamas County.

Total amount of this agreement is \$3,192,775 an increase of \$500,631. Funds are budgeted in the Healthy Start and grant stream for fiscal years 2009-2011 to cover this agreement. No County General Funds are involved. This agreement is effective upon acceptance by all parties and will terminate June 30, 2011. This contract was approved by County Counsel on June 10, 2009.

for Building Improvements to the Gladstone Center for Children and Families facility.**

The Community Development Division, of the Department of Human Services, requests the approval of a Construction Agreement with Nomarco, Inc. for building improvements that will renovate 3,450 square feet of commercial space for the Family Stepping Stones Relief Nursery. The building improvements will include renovations to the entry area doors and windows, flooring, walls, improvements to the heating, ventilation and cooling system and improvements to the parking area. The Gladstone Center for Children and Families facility is owned by the Gladstone School District and located at 18907 Portland Ave. in Gladstone.

After review of the eleven (11) bids submitted on October 22, 2009, Nomarco, Inc. was determined to be the lowest responsive, responsible bidder substantially complying with the requirements of the solicitation documents. Below is a list of the 3 lowest bids:

- 1. Nomarco, Inc. \$182,000
- 2. Paradigm Construction \$240,457
- 3. O'Brien Construction \$241,300

Financial Impact: American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (CDBG R grant) \$ 137,959
Gladstone School District\$ 44,041
 Total Construction Cost: \$ 182,000

No County General Fund dollars are involved. The Construction Agreement was reviewed and approved by County Counsel on September 30, 2009.

**Approval of an Agreement between Clackamas County and
Clackamas Community Land Trust to use Neighborhood Stabilization Program Funds
to Purchase and Rehabilitate a Foreclosed Home**

The Community Development Division of the Department of Human Services requests approval of an Agreement with Clackamas Community Land Trust (CCLT) to use federal Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) funds to purchase and rehabilitate a single family foreclosed home located at 701 Mary Drive in Molalla. Under the community land trust model of homeownership, CCLT will retain ownership of the land and sell the rehabilitated home at a reduced price to an eligible low- or middle-income household. The homeowner and CCLT will enter into a 99-year land lease which is recorded in the records of Clackamas County.

Authorized under the federal Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008, the NSP provides emergency Community Development Block Grant funds to support efforts to stabilize neighborhoods with high numbers of vacant and foreclosed homes that might otherwise become sources of abandonment and blight. Clackamas County is a sub-grantee of the State of Oregon which receives NSP funding through the US Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The NSP funds will be in the form of a no-interest deferred-payment loan. CCLT will use proceeds from the sale of the home to repay a portion of the NSP funds. The balance of the NSP funds will remain in the home as a permanent subsidy. The rehabilitation work will bring the home up to the County's rehabilitation standards and improve the energy efficiency of the home. CCLT has a waiting list of pre-qualified buyers and works with lenders to help homebuyers access credit.

The total amount of this agreement for purchase and rehabilitation is \$245,000. No general fund dollars are involved in this project. County Counsel approved this agreement on December 2, 2009.

Recommendation

We recommend approval of this Agreement and that Cindy Becker be authorized to sign all related documents on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners.

The Clackamas County Community Health Division (CCCHD) of the Department of Human Services requests the approval of the 2010 Oregon Health Plan Provider Services Contract for Mental Health Organizations with the State of Oregon, acting by and through its Department of Human Services, Addictions and Mental Health (AMH) Division to continue provision of mental health services to enrollees of the Oregon Health Plan Medicaid Demonstration Project (OHP) and State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP).

This is a revenue contract, the compensation mechanism is structured on a per member per month (capitation) basis for each OHP/SCHIP eligible individual enrolled with the counties under this contract. Calculation of payments and rates are set forth in Exhibit C. This contract has been reviewed and approved by County Counsel on November 11, 2009. No County General funds are involved. It commences on January 1, 2010 and continues through December 31, 2010.

Approval to Apply for a Renewal Grant through the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program for the purpose of providing funds to existing local emergency shelter programs in Clackamas County that deliver Services to the Hungry and Homeless Population

The Social Services Division of the Department of Human Services requests the approval to apply for a Renewal Grant Application through the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program (EFSP) for Phase 28 of the EFSP Program for the purpose of providing funds to existing local emergency shelter programs in Clackamas County that deliver services to the hungry and homeless population. This grant provides emergency mass shelter services to the homeless.

This grant will provide an estimated 6,850 person bed nights. A person bed night is defined as one person sheltered for one night. These funds will provide emergency shelter bed nights to homeless families with children, victims of domestic violence and homeless youth. An estimated 2,283 households will be served.

Total amount of this grant proposal is for \$85,625 for a one year period. The grant term is for the period December 1, 2009 through November 30, 2010. No County General Funds are involved.

Recommendation:

We recommend the approval to apply for this renewal grant and that Cindy Becker, Director of Human Services be authorized to sign all documents necessary on behalf of the Board of Commissioners.

APPROVING INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH METRO TO
IMPLEMENT THE YEAR 20 METRO AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT
ANNUAL WASTE REDUCTION PLAN AND THE RECYCLE AT WORK PROGRAM

Metro has approved the County's Waste Reduction Plan for Year Twenty (FY09-10) as required by the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan (RSWMP). Metro redistributes funds earned from disposal of garbage at Metro's owned and franchised facilities. The regional distribution of funds is calculated based on the population (for the Annual Plan) and the number of employees (for Recycle at Work) in each jurisdiction. Cities within the County are eligible recipients of these funds. The County, through a series of agreements, performs the annual responsibilities of the RSWMP as outlined in the Waste Reduction Plan for the Cities of Barlow; Canby, Damascus, Estacada, Gladstone, Happy Valley, Lake Oswego, Milwaukie, Molalla, Oregon City, Sandy, West Linn, and Wilsonville, in exchange for the funds allocated to those jurisdictions by Metro.

Metro is prepared to allocate \$162,217.00 to provide assistance in maintaining the waste reduction programs currently in place throughout the county. Additionally, \$107,685.00 is available to partially fund the Recycle at Work Program. A signed Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Metro is required in order to receive funds. Additionally, Metro requires the County enter into binding agreements with those cities requesting the County perform the services associated with the Plan. The Scope of Work for the Annual Waste Reduction Plan, Scope of Work for the Recycle at Work program, the Year Twenty Plan, the agreements with the Cities and the Year Nineteen Annual and Recycle at Work Reports are attached. (Attachments A, B, C,D and E respectively).

The intergovernmental agreement form with Metro has been reviewed and approved by County Counsel.

In order to receive the funding, the Board must approve the annual plan and sign the attached intergovernmental agreement.

We request this item be placed on the agenda as a consent item.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends the Board of County Commissioners approve the Year Twenty Plans and Recycle at Work Programs and the Intergovernmental Agreement with Metro to fund the Programs. Please feel free to call me at 503-742-4466 with any questions.

Clackamas County has been participating in the regional process to designate urban and rural reserves for future urban growth in the Portland Metro area. One key area of importance to the county is the French Prairie area near Wilsonville. The Board of County Commissioners has determined through technical analysis and public input that the French Prairie area is best suited for agricultural use and should be considered a Rural Reserve in the regional land use process.

This resolution affirms the Board's commitment to preserving the important agricultural uses of this land and describes the Board's intent to protect this land from inappropriate urbanization or other encroachment.

This matter comes before the Board of County Commissioners of Clackamas County ("Board") as the County governing body at its regularly scheduled business meeting on December 17, 2009.

WHEREAS, Oregon's statewide land use planning program, originated in 1973 under Senate Bill 100, provides protection of farm and forest lands, conservation of natural resources, orderly and efficient development, coordination among local governments, and citizen involvement; and,

WHEREAS, The statewide land use planning program is intended to afford all Oregonians predictability and sustainability in the preservation of farm and forest lands while providing for industrial, commercial and housing development within a compact urban form; and,

WHEREAS, The land use system under the hierarchy of lands process has had success in directing growth in our cities in a healthier compact, urban form, however, significant amounts of prime agricultural lands have been lost to development pressures within the Portland-Metro Region; and,

WHEREAS, The Oregon Legislature approved Senate Bill 1011 in 2007 in Partnership with local governments, business and industry groups, developers, and the agricultural industry in the Portland Metro region to identify and designate areas outside the current urban growth boundary that are best suited for future housing and employment as urban reserves and to identify and designate rural reserve areas that should remain working farms and forests or natural areas for the next 40 to 50 years; and,

WHEREAS, The Oregon Department of Agriculture has designated the French Prairie area of the Northern Willamette Valley as Foundation farm land, the highest quality designation for agricultural resource land; and,

WHEREAS, French Prairie is a productive, versatile, sustainable and historic agricultural center, which contains some of the most productive and diverse farmland in the world, and serves as the heart of the \$1 billion agriculture industry, one of Clackamas County's most important traded sectors; and,

WHEREAS, The Board has determined through a process of technical evaluation and broad public input that French Prairie should be designated through the regional process as a Rural Reserve; and,

WHEREAS, The Clackamas County Planning Commission, the Project Advisory Committee, and other local jurisdictions have conducted independent evaluations of the French Prairie area and all have arrived at the conclusion that French Prairie should remain in agricultural use; and,

WHEREAS, Clackamas County has demonstrated its commitment to and investment in French Prairie as an agricultural industry center through a long-term ongoing partnership with Oregon State University at the North Willamette Research and Extension Center located on 150 acres of county-owned land in French Prairie and is dedicated to strengthening agriculture in Oregon and specifically the North Willamette Valley.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. Clackamas County will continue to protect the French Prairie Area from inappropriate urbanization and development, in accordance with Oregon's statewide and regional land use processes.

2. Clackamas County will continue to oppose any proposal for urbanization and development that threatens or puts at risk the viability of the economically significant agricultural land in the French Prairie area.
