Annual Report 2011

CASES

- Reviewed 8,588 cases for adult prosecution
- Issued 2,127 felony cases
 - ◊ 1,747 felony property cases
 - ◊ 964 drug cases
 - ◊ 50 Interagency Task Force drug cases
- Issued 4,235 misdemeanor cases
- Issued 460 domestic violence cases
- Issued 302 juvenile delinquency cases
- Reviewed 306 cases where abused, neglected and abandoned children needed protection
- Consulted on 100% of dependency petitions filed and declined
- Reviewed 710 domestic violence cases
- Ordered more than \$995,000 in restitution and compensation to victims
- Provided \$18,947 in restitution to businesses for bad checks through the check enforcement program

ACHIEVEMENTS

- The District Attorney's Case Management Program continued to increase the efficiency of the criminal justice system by ensuring prompt resolution of cases
 - ◊ 44% of all criminal cases were settled with a guilty plea within five weeks after the first court appearance
 - ◊ Only 16% of all criminal cases were set for trial which resulted in a dramatic reduction in court appearances for victims, witnesses and law enforcement
 - ◊ Saved taxpayer money through reduced law enforcement overtime
- The Child Support Program collected more than \$20,237,000 for children during the 2011 federal fiscal year (October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011)
- Partnership with the Interagency Task Force reduced the distribution and manufacture of methamphetamine and shut down drug houses
- The Victim Assistance Program provided 36,855 direct victim services to Clackamas County victims in 2011.
- Since 2002, \$236,747 in restitution has been collected and distributed to Clackamas County businesses for bad checks through the check enforcement program.
