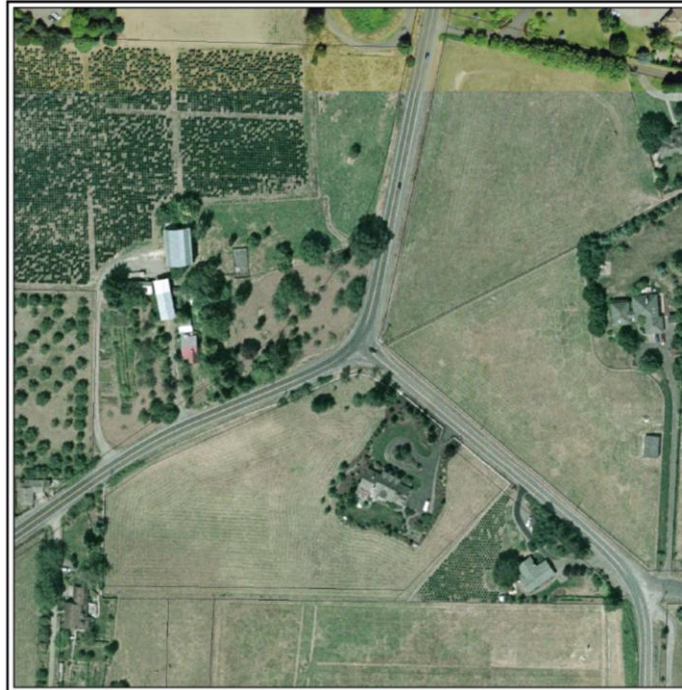
As of early May, traffic control signs are being put in place and a sanitary drain line is being relocated.

Roadway realignment work will begin in mid to late May, depending on weather conditions.

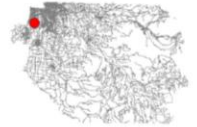

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Scope: Reconstruct the intersection of Stafford Road and Mountain Road to improve sightlines, reduce crashes, and increase safety and traffic flow.

Details: The project will:

- Shift the intersection approximately 100 feet west of its present location to straighten the curve of Stafford Road
- Add a left-turn lane on southbound Stafford Road
- Add a right-turn lane and left-turn lane on Mountain Road
- Add five-foot paved shoulders on both sides of Stafford Road

Detour/road closures: There are no plans for closures or detours at this time. There will be restricted travel throughout construction and occasionally brief delays of up to 20 minutes.

You may be interested to know . . .

The intersection has had a number of safety issues over the past several years primarily related to the horizontal curvature and the lack of a southbound left-turn lane.
