

# Section 5: Plan Maintenance Updates

## Monitoring and Implementing the Plan

Throughout the last five years, the HMAc used the process outlined in the plan maintenance section to assist in plan implementation and updates. Although the process provided direction, some changes have been made to make the HMAc a more functional entity.

## Convener

The County Administrator was previously identified as the convener for the HMAc. However, because the County Administrator has a demanding schedule, it is difficult for someone in this position to serve as the regular convener for the HMAc. Clackamas County Emergency Management will provide a representative to serve in this capacity. The County Administrator continues to be involved as a regular HMAc member.

## Implementation through Existing Programs

The County will be adopting the latest updates / requirements from Title 13 of Metro's Functional Plan (Water Quality) that pertains to Goal 5 resources within the Portland metropolitan area. Through these updates, Metro has identified new riparian Goal 5 resources, along with protection programs for each resource. The County shall be implementing a work program for adopting, implementing and conforming to these Title 13 updates over the course of the next 12 to 18 months. This timeframe conforms to the DLCD adoption process timeline.

## Evaluating and Updating the Plan

Evaluating and updating the NHMP is an ongoing effort. The HMAc has provided the following revision to make this a more functional process.

## Formal Review Process

The NHMP shows that the plan will be updated on an annual basis. Although the HMAc identifies and prioritizes action items for funding on an annual basis, it is unrealistic to undergo a comprehensive plan review an update every year. For this reason, the HMAc will conduct a comprehensive plan review every three years. This timeline will allow the HMAc to incorporate new information, making the FEMA-required 5-year review an easier and more realistic task.
