Coop In Time:

- 1. The Poultry Show is held throughout the fair. Birds will be accepted Monday, August 14, 2017 from Noon to 9:00 PM.
- 2. Entries will be released between 10:00 AM 3:00 PM (Per Fair Management) Sunday August 20, 2017.

Specific Rules:

- 1. Due to recent Avian Influenza concerns, water fowl <u>WILL NOT</u> be included in the 2017 Clackamas County Fair.
- 2. Exhibitors should read General Rules and Regulations and Livestock Department Rules found on Clackamas County Fair website under Exhibitor Handbook.
- 3. There will be no entries accepted the day of coop in.
- 4. No birds allowed in the barn until passing health check overseen by the Superintendent.
- 5. Birds showing evidence of disease will not be accepted and entry fees will be forfeited.
- The superintendent or any assigned judge shall have full authority to disbar from competition any entry which is too immature, diseased, or otherwise unworthy of the breed it represents.
- 7. During the period of the fair, the fair will feed and water the birds.
- 8. All Birds exhibited **MUST** have numbered leg bands.
- 9. Competition is open to anyone; 4-H and FFA exhibitors may show in Public Competition as long as they show different birds than they are showing in 4-H or FFA.
- 10. There will be no advertising, premiums or anything else placed on the coops or in the building without the approval of the superintendent.

11. Birds will be tested for Pullorum after judging, unless NPIP or other testing papers are submitted.
