Douglas Fir (Stand of 12 trees)

This stand of 12 Douglas Fir trees is a native species of the Pacific Northwest.

A typical Douglas Fir can reach 200 to 250 feet and have a trunk diameter from 4 feet 9 inches to 6 feet 6 inches.

This Douglas Fir stand is home to the local red-tailed hawks and their fledglings. The site is also certified as a wildlife habitat site by the National Wildlife Federation site.

The site is located in the Lake Grove area which was logged to heat the Oregon Iron Company foundry that closed in 1894.

This tree stand is nominated and approved under the Heritage Tree Category of a collection.
