**Broadleaf Maple**

This Broadleaf Maple tree is located within the Oak Grove unincorporated area of Clackamas County.

This tree species typically grows in proximity to streams, but can also be found within riparian hardwood forests among conifers and mixed evergreens or oaks. This particular tree is found on the original Susan Creighton donation land claim (#50), one of the first platted land plats in the Oak Grove area. Today it is part of the Rolling Meadows development, built by Al Anspach in the mid 1960s.

The exact age of this tree is unknown, but is believed to be approximately 200 years old.

The trunk base is unique in that it is difficult to determine if it is four trees merged together at the trunk or one tree. The arborist has determined that this is one tree. This particular tree species is not typically found in the urban environment.

This tree is nominated and approved under the Heritage Tree categories of specimen and historic landmark.
